
From the President of the Board of Trustees



From the Director

Dear Members and Friends,

Where does the preservation of our local history fall in the scope of the important work of our lives?

2010 was a year of making connections and continuing to move the Centerøs expansion plan forward. I noticed more members visiting the Fenton the past year, both during events and in general. I finally met members who have supported our work for years. It has inspired me meet all of the Fentonøs members this year. The wide varieties of reasons why you support the Center are touching. The Fenton Board and staff, with significant leadership by Board member Juanita Flint, held the first membership drive since 2004. The drive served



two purposes; to bring in new members and to build awareness of Fentonøs value.

I noticed more volunteers coming forward to do meaningful work this past year then ever before. The staff has nurtured and partnered with many talented member volunteers to tackle the big jobs of managing the collections, researching requests and staffing the events. Without these volunteersøtime and talents we would be hard pressed to provide many of the services our visitors take for granted: the holiday exhibit, genealogy requests, local history requests, collections accessioning, collections finding aids, tour guides for the cemetery tours and event staffing. Volunteers are one of the most important aspects of a non-profitor success.

ŏI havenøt been here since I was a kid,ö was heard many times this past year. Many local residents decided to visit the museum. They were surprised and pleased by the exhibits that sparked memories and taught them new facts about Jamestown. Many community groups toured the museum as part of their meeting, a few even held their meetings in our rustic education room.

The 1960 time capsule opening was a big event this year that grew out of a grassroots interest in Jamestown and those that remembered burying the Sesquicentennial time capsule. A great crowd was on hand for the unveiling. A 2010 time capsule has been buried in the same spot by the bridge on Jones & Gifford Ave. Thank you to all that were instrumental in making the event successful.




The Hall House is being prepared for itos next õlife.ö The building has two unique spaces for commercial rent that will support the new research center and work areas. Once those renters are in place the Center will expand into the Hall House and free up portions of the Fenton Mansion to better tell our local and national story. The Fenton Mansion is about ready to get a õface liftö. The exterior of the building will be undergoing repointing and in some cases, rebuilding, over the next construction season. Funding for the project is from New York State, our members and the Lenna Foundation. More support is needed if you would like to help.

The Fenton is the community resource and we are very happy to share it! The Fenton Trustees are continuing their plans to make the Fenton History Center a strong tourism destination and local history source; a place to experience living in a Victorian era home, a place to learn about everyday life 150 years ago, a place to use the latest technology to find a long ago family member, a place to see and learn about what makes Jamestown a great place to be.

ATTENDANCE AND WEBSITE USAGE



- The museum had an 18% increase in visitation while the research center had a 23% decrease. However the revenue from research requests was up from last year partially due to a fee increase.
- Public school classroom visits dropped by 12% this year. Over the past three years that is a
 drop of 63%. A number of factors have caused the decrease, some within our control,
 others not. While the number of schools outside the City of Jamestown taking advantage
 of our programming has increased, it is not enough to make up the loss of the Jamestown
 classes.

The Fenton History Center will ensure the preservation of the Fenton Mansion, while providing adequate facilities to meet the growing needs of the organization and the people it serves. A superior regional history and genealogy research center will accommodate local and visiting researchers. The facilities will also afford space for state-of-the-art storage, educational programs, collections management, exhibit 4 preparation, and visitor orientation.

The staff and Board of Trustees will offer responsible and enthusiastic leadership for the future. Professionally trained, the staff will provide direction in the implementation of current best practices. To strengthen the FHC¢s ability to accomplish its mission, an informed Board of Trustees will provide additional guidance and strive to secure the fiscal health of the organization for years to come.

The Fenton History Center will also reach beyond the walls of the Fenton Mansion to engage area residents, students, visitors, and institutions with an increasing variety of activities. Off-site, traveling, and web-based exhibits will compliment multi-media in-house exhibits. Web-based technology will enhance the services offered by the library and research center. Whenever possible, the FHC will collaborate with other historical agencies, non-profit organizations, schools, and businesses. The FHC will be recognized as an indispensable asset to the intellectual and cultural life of the surrounding community.

The **loss** at the end of the year is due to:

- a 50% decrease in the local school programming, a loss of \$15,000.
- a shortfall in funding for the \$5,000 match needed for the IMLS Archive Management Grant.
- a shortfall in memberships (\$4,000) and decrease in endowment returns (\$1,300).

Donations by the general public and membership were the best they have been in years.

The **restricted funds** grew because of strong support for the brick restoration project and the archive management project.



The exhibits this year were well attended and brought in many donations of artifacts and archival materials to add to the collections as well as more stories for future reference.


"Quilt Stories" was a Mansion-wide exhibit of the many quilts in the collection, concentrating on Crazy Quilts and Signature Quilts.
