WHIRLYGIGS

Whirlygigs (or whirligigs) are a simple old fashioned toy to make. The earliest examples of a whirlygig are from the 1600's in Europe and would have been a popular toy with the early settlers in America. There is evidence Native American children had them as well. Below are 2 ways to make your own pioneer toy!

Version 1:

What you need:

- An old button with 2 or 4 holes in the middle
- A piece of string or year approximately 3 feet long

How to:

- 1. Thread the yarn through 2 of the holes on the button. If the button has 4 holes make sure you use the diagonal holes.
- 2. Tie the ends of the yarn together.
- 3. Pull yarn so that the button is in the middle of the loop of yarn. See the "To Play" instructions at the bottom of the page.

Version 2:

What you need:

- Scissors
- Pencil
- Crayons
- Copy of the Penny Spinner and Whirlygigs Template

- Thin cardboard like a cereal box
- Glue stick
- Something sharp to poke holes
- Piece of string or yarn approximately 3 feet long

How to:

- 1. Color two of the designs from the Penny Spinner and Whirlygigs template and cut them out.
- 2. Trace around one on your card board and cut it out. Using a glue stick glue one of the design wheels on each side.
- 3. Have an adult use scissors, a knife, or a sharp skewer to put 2 small holes through the cardboard circle. Place one hole at each end of the bold solid line in the middle.
- 4. Thread the yarn through the holes and tie it to make a loop.
- 5. Slide the whirligig to the middle of the yarn loop, and follow the "To Play" instructions below.

To Play:

- 1. Grab the yarn loop on both ends with the whirligig in the middle.
- 2. Twist it toward you to wind up the yarn.
- 3. Move your hands in an out to make the whirly gig spin back and forth.
