NOTES FROM THE DIRECTOR

2025 was a busy year. Thank you to the staff, board of trustees and volunteers that helped me relearn the ropes of managing this great organization. The events were successful because of their dedication to our local history.

This year we will fully launch the **Vision 2030** campaign to create our future:

1. **Promote** and build up the monthly donors to return \$1,500 per month in 2026, \$5,000 per month by 2030.

2. **Build** a third building to meet the growing needs of the organization; visible large collection storage, exhibit space, a second gift shop, staff workspace, 50-

seat presentation space, and a home for the restored #93 Trolley. We have some great momentum going into 2026!

3. **Sustain** the Education Coordinator position beyond 2026 and expand our educational programming, bringing more programs into local schools and increasing opportunities for families and community groups.

4. **Fund** additional collections staff, including a long, overdue and critical full inventory of our artifacts and archival materials.

5. **Complete** major restoration projects, such as the Mansion roof and windows, collaborating with our City of Jamestown partners.

6. **Build** the endowment funds at the Chautauqua Region Community Foundation to ensure we can continue to carry out our essential work. From preserving

REMEMBERING LUCILLE BALL'S VISIT TO JAMESTOWN 70 YEARS AGO

As the calendar turned to the year 1956, Jamestown residents were all talking about the recent announcement that Lucille Ball and Desi Arnaz would be coming to Jamestown in February for the world premiere of their latest movie *Forever Darling*.

Mr. and Mrs. Earle O. Hultquist and Mr. and Mrs. Alldor M. Nord were the leaders of the Planning Committee for the famous couple's visit. At the time, Mr. Hultquist was a leading Jamestown businessman and Mr. Nord was the president and treasurer of Union National Furniture Company. The Planning Committee had hundreds of other area residents who donated, organized, planned and helped make this event a roaring success.

Lucille had been back to Jamestown in earlier years, but this would be the first visit to her hometown since becoming the star of America's favorite television show *I Love Lucy* in 1951. Her husband and co-star, Desi Arnaz, had never been to Jamestown.

Lucille was born on August 6, 1911 to Henry Durrell and Desiree Evelyn Hunt Ball when the family lived on Stewart Avenue. Henry worked for Bell Telephone Company, and Desiree and the children traveled with him as he

Got Her Start Posing Photographs for Cigarette Advertising — Has Had Many Successes on Silver Screen.

Lucille Ball, first 100 per cent. Jamestown girl to crash the golden gates of Hollywood, last night received the press at the home of relatives at 20 Twelfth Street, just before she left for another year in filmdom. Miss Ball, who got her big chance in Eddie Cantor's "Roman Scandals," and who has appeared in several films during the last year, has been signed to start work Monday in Cantor's latest picture, "The Treasure Hunt."

Describing her work as hard, but interesting, Miss Ball exclaimed: "I just simply love and adore it. Mr. Goldwyn is a wonderful man to work for. It is so much fun meeting the people on the coast and they are so nice."

The local girl got her start in pictures through renown as a model for poster advertising and in three musical revues in New York City. She has appeared in several pictures; in one she doubled for Constance Bennett, whom she closely resembles. She has been signed for three pictures by United Artists, "Treasure Hunt," "Barbary Coast" and "Resurrection." These pictures will keep her busy from six months to a year.

Bound for California.

was assigned to work away from home. Henry passed away in February 1915, and Desiree, Lucille, and baby Fred moved back to Jamestown to live with her parents.

When Lucille was eight years old, Desiree married Ed Peterson. Lucille and Fred subsequently lived with Ed's parents on the north side of Jamestown for a time. Viewers of *I Love Lucy* will remember a scene with Lucy and Ethel (Vivian Vance) were making coffee. When Lucy put the coffee grounds in the pot and then also threw in the egg shells, she announced "My grandmother was Swedish," referring to Mrs. Peterson.

Lucille attended but did not graduate from Jamestown High School. During her teenage years she loved acting, playing parts in various area productions and at home for her family. In 1926 at age 15, her mother borrowed money so Lucille could enroll in a drama school in New York City for the summer. In her biography *Love, Lucy*, Lucille wrote that at the end of the semester, the

school told Desiree that Lucille was wasting her time, and Desiree her money, because Lucille "doesn't have what it takes."

Lucille would return to New York City when she was 17, working as a model. After recuperating in Jamestown from a severe case of rheumatoid arthritis, she again went back to New York City in 1932, determined to pursue an acting career. She again worked as a model, a "Chesterfield Girl" and also did "chorus work" in Broadway shows.

In a chance encounter on a New York City street in 1933, an agent that knew Lucille said "Do you want to move to Hollywood?" Her biography said she ran to the agent's office and signed up immediately for the job. After getting established in Hollywood, she had small parts in several films, her first "credited role" coming in 1936 in the movie *Chatterbox*. She met Desi Arnaz while they were both filming the movie *Too Many Girls*, and they were married on November 30, 1940.

In 1948, Lucille was the star in a radio comedy, playing the role of

Liz Cooper in *My Favorite Husband*. In 1950, the CBS television network asked her and Desi to develop the show for television, and *I Love Lucy* premiered on October 15, 1951.

Obviously, there are many more details about the life of Lucille Ball, and many biographies have been written about her life and achievements. As we pause now to await the details of her triumphant visit to Jamestown in February 1956, we can also think of her as a little girl growing up without a father in early 20th century Jamestown and Celoron. We can see her walking to School #1 at East 8th and Pine Streets when she lived with the Petersons and as a brave teenager taking the train to New York City by herself several times to follow her acting dreams. She returns home, sick, at the height of the depression in 1930, and, with the help of her family, recovers and returns again to New York City in 1932, only 21 years old, determined to succeed, despite many odds against her.

And now the most famous comedienne in the world would be "coming home."



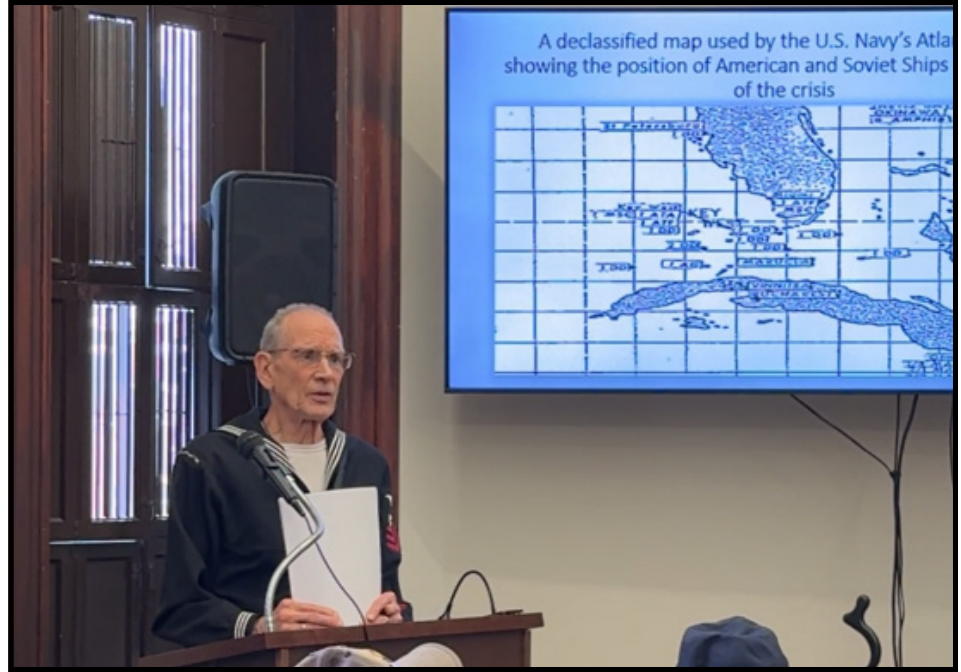

Jack Anderson, of Jamestown, entered the Navy in September 1959 and was discharged in June 1967.

His power point presentation of his experiences on Assault Craft Unit Two during the Cuban Missile Crisis in October 1962 and the backstory of political powers involved was very inter-



esting. The release of the Kennedy Papers made it possible for him to put more details together during the 14-day standoff and realize that nuclear war was even closer than anyone realized.

ABOUT THE FENTON

The Fenton History Center of Jamestown, N.Y. is seeking a part-time Education Coordinator. Under the supervision of the Executive Director, the Education Coordinator will be responsible for the development and implementation of hands-on, interactive educational programs for students, families and life-long learners.

The Fenton History Center is a small, vibrant local history museum with a professional staff and dedicated volunteer team. The Center is housed in a City of Jamestown owned 1863 Mansion and separate research center. The staff and volunteer team work together to lead and teach our local history to all ages, residents and visitors alike, through diversified programming.

DUTIES

- Implementing outreach and field trip programs including oversight of museum teacher volunteers
- Marketing the outreach and field trip programs throughout the community
- Scheduling education programs for all ages
- Developing/implementing/overseeing on-site education programs using the 1863 Fenton Mansion's exhibits and period rooms
- Assisting with exhibit design and installation as needed
- Events coordination with the staff
- Maintaining program records regarding budget, supplies, attendance, evaluations

The Education Coordinator will work approximately 21 hours per week. Hours will be flexible but will include weekend days and some evenings as needed. This position requires driving in a personal vehicle, mileage outside the Jamestown area will be reimbursed.

Teacher certification is desired, additional hours in museum studies and/or past experience working in a museum setting for at least 3 years is desired. Candidate must have an interest in local history. Candidate must be comfortable in a classroom setting and understand the public education culture.

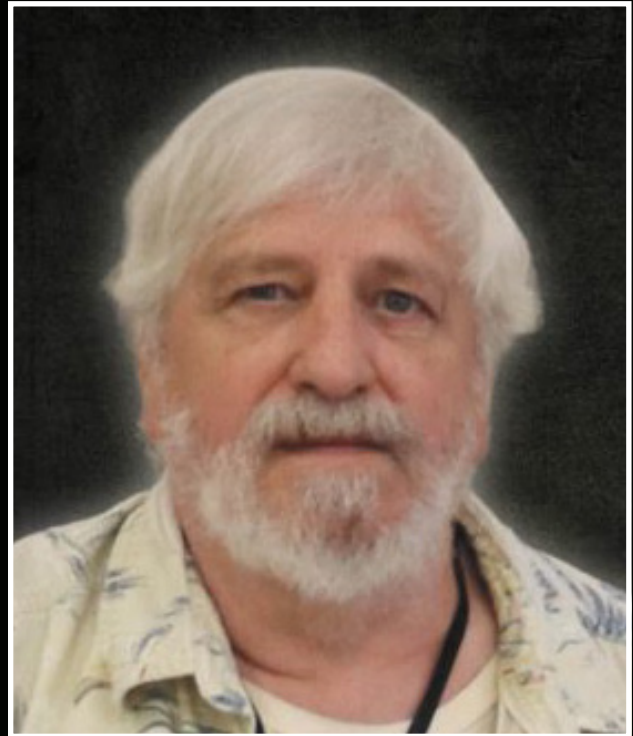
In Memoriam **R. Wayne Leamer** **1950–2025**

The Fenton History Center mourns the loss of Ralph Wayne Leamer, who passed away unexpectedly on December 8, 2025, at his home in Ashville at the age of 75.

Wayne was born on May 22, 1950, in Dunkirk, New York, and spent his early years in Ripley, where he graduated from Ripley High School in 1968. He operated an electronics repair business for several years. After purchasing his first computer, he began entering family birthdays and anniversaries, which led to a growing interest in genealogy. Over the past several years, he worked on numerous projects involving the scanning, indexing, downloading, and preservation of local historical records.

He was a member and volunteer at the Fenton History Center, where he worked on numerous projects over the years. Wayne was also an active member of the Chautauqua County Genealogical Society, serving as Membership Chairman since 2001 and as publisher of *The Chautauqua Genealogist* newsletter since 2007, among many other contributions. More recently, he volunteered weekly at the Chautauqua County Historian's Office.

Over many years, Wayne provided the Fenton History Center, the Chautauqua County Genealogical Society, and other organizations with a wide range of research materials, often delivered on disks, flash drives, or in bound volumes. These included scanned documents, compiled records,



and large, searchable PDF files that brought together hundreds and sometimes thousands of pages of historical material. His work emphasized accessibility and long-term usability, allowing researchers to locate information efficiently within otherwise unwieldy collections.

Much of Wayne's work was quiet and behind the scenes, but the resources he created and shared will continue to support research and preservation for years to come. His absence leaves a void that is felt across the Chautauqua County historical and genealogical community.

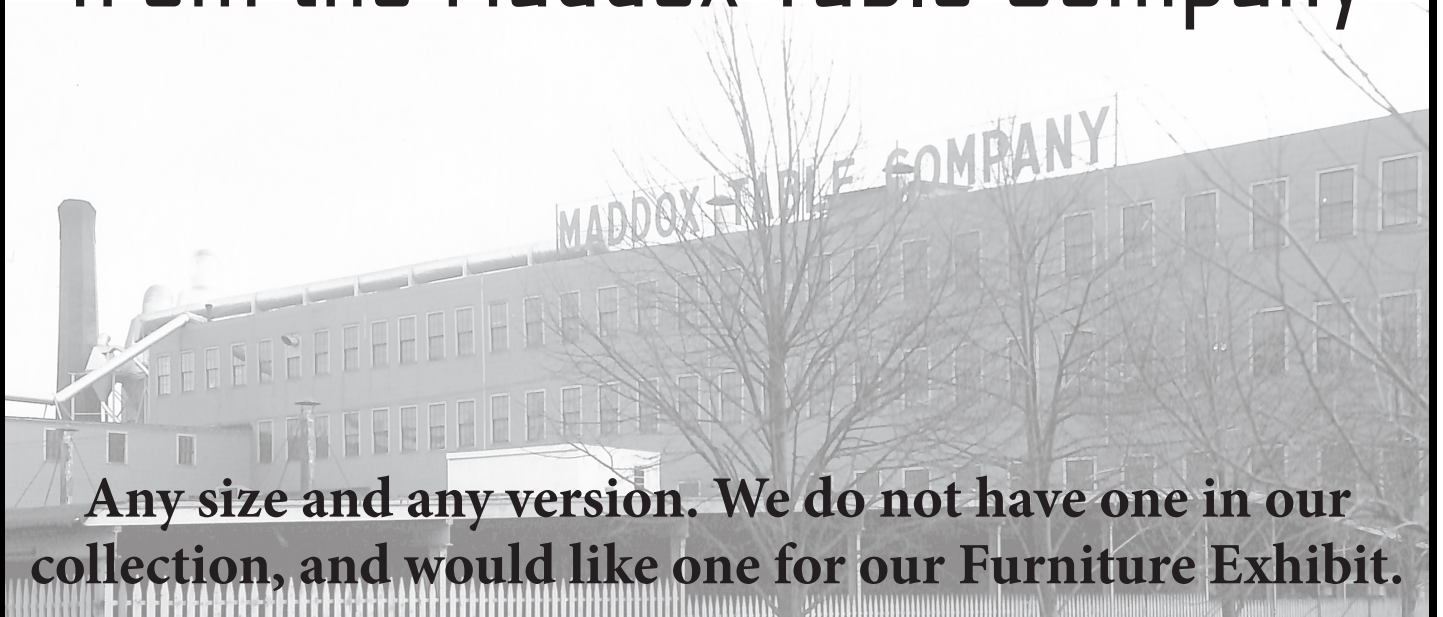
